As a member it is more of a 'hands off' role, but you will be responsible for holding the trustees to account. We would like someone who will be independent from the school, but has a passion for the local community and wanting the best for children and their education. The members meet once or twice a year.

A trustee will be more involved and would be required to attend regular meetings (approximately 6 per year, and possible committee meetings) and also carry out some monitoring visits at the school. Again we would like someone who is passionate about the local area and wanting the best education for the children in our care. Areas of expertise that we are looking for but not limited to are: HR, Finance, Early Years, Education.

We are committed to safeguarding children and you will be required to undertake an enhanced criminal records disclosure check.
