

PE and Sports Grant

The premium is ring fenced and must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this. A list of possible uses has been suggested.

Trewirgie Infants' and Nursery School has decided to use the money to:

- Retain a Sports Facilitator to work alongside our PE coordinator to enhance learning in this subject across school
- Support and engage the least coordinated children in physical activities through the development of Fun Fit activities.
- Increase pupils' participation in the sports and physical activities
- Provide more places for pupils on after school sports clubs
- Improve assessment and resources to support the development of the subject
